DEADLINE

Individuals interested in standing for nomination must complete this form and submit it, along with any supporting materials, in PDF format to the Nominations Committee by January 28, 2021 at 4:30 PM using the upload page on the College website. Applications received or found to be incomplete after this deadline will not be reviewed. Please note that at least one interview by Nominations Committee members is compulsory as part of the nominations process.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR POTENTIAL NOMINEES

Service on the College of Applied Biology's Council is a significant contribution to the public and the profession. Members who make this commitment do so with the understanding that this role's primary function is to serve the public through the dutiful administration of the *Professional Governance Act* and Regulations.

Members of Council have a fiduciary duty to the College of Applied Biology and must carry out in good faith the duties prescribed to them through legislation and the College's Bylaws.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE COLLEGE OF APPLIED BIOLOGY

The College and its Council have the duty to uphold and protect the public interest respecting the practice of professional applied biology. As a member of Council, you also have a number of duties and responsibilities in your role as a council member. These duties are in addition to the Code of Ethics.

Duty of Care: In making decisions, you must act in the best interests of the public. You do not represent a segment of the membership. Decisions are to be based upon facts and reliable information and action is not to be taken without first taking care to be properly informed. You must exercise the degree of skill and diligence reasonably expected from an ordinary person having your knowledge and experience.

Duty of Loyalty: You must maintain the confidentiality of information received by you in your capacity as Council member both before and after completion of your term on Council and you must avoid situations where you could put yourself in a position of conflict between your own private interests and the best interests of the College of Applied Biology.

Duty of Compliance: You must carry out the College's duties and objects and take all necessary and reasonable measures to ensure compliance with laws and regulations as well as policies that apply to the College and its Council.

Council members are expected to adhere to the College's Code of Ethics, Council member expectations and policies and to perform and uphold their duties with objectivity, honesty, and ethically without personal or corporate gain. All Councillors are required to sign an Oath of Office to demonstrate that the requirements of the role and the commitment expected are understood.

ELIGIBILITY

Registered Professional Biologists, Registered Biology Technologists and Applied Biology Technicians in good standing are eligible to stand for election as a Councillor. Candidates for the office of Vice-President must have served on Council for one year in the last five (5) years. (See Position Profiles)

TERMS OF OFFICE

The Vice-President is elected as part of a three-year progressive term where they serve in the first year as Vice-President (President-elect), the second year as President, and the third year as Past President. Councillors are being elected for two- and three-year terms in order to stagger appointments year over year. If applying for Councillor, please consider that the term may be up to a three-year commitment: the candidate receiving the most votes for Councillor will be elected to the three-year term and the candidate with the second-most votes for Councillor will be elected to the two-year term.

Submit a completed copy of this form and any supporting documents in PDF format using the upload tool on the College website. Submissions will be reviewed by Cairine Green, Chair, Nominations Committee and members of the Nominations Committee.

Applications must be **received by January 28, 2021 at 4:30 PM** to be considered for candidacy.
