

The Opportunity:

As the Senior Environmental Coordinator - Wildlife, you will make a significant contribution to Canadian Natural's Environmental programs. This position will develop and implement wildlife management and mitigation programs at Canadian Natural's Oil Sand Mining operations while reporting to the Lead of Research (Wetlands & Aquatics). You will develop strategic wildlife management plans and be responsible for ensuring safe, high quality execution of field programs that deliver on regulatory and stakeholder commitments. Although located at Horizon, this position will deliver support for Oil Sands Mining at both the Albian and Horizon mining operations.

Key Accountabilities:

- Develop and implement wildlife management, monitoring, and mitigation programs for Oil Sands mining operations
- Coordinate with regulatory agencies on matters pertaining to wildlife deterrents, environmental monitoring and regulatory compliance
- Perform inspections of facilities for environmental compliance tracking
- Manage wildlife research programs, participate in multi-stakeholder regional initiatives, and provide site wildlife awareness support
- Support and execute field activities for wildlife management programs, e.g. nest survey, wildlife sweeps, injured wildlife response, nuisance wildlife management, proactive site inspections to identify waste/wildlife issues, and monitoring programs (cameras, acoustic recording units)
- Work with the mine reclamation team to establish wildlife habitat within reclamation areas
