#### **The Role**

PETRONAS Canada has an exciting opportunity for a Field Regulatory & Environmental Coordinator to join our team in Fort St. John, BC. Reporting to the Manager, Regulatory & Operational Compliance, the successful candidate will assist in developing our compliance strategy to ensure that PETRONAS Canada and our operations are fully compliant with regulatory and environmental responsibilities. The incumbent will support Field Operations with a focus on environmental condition requirements, provide advice and guidance for effective communication with regulators, as well as assess field operations for operational compliance. This role will also be heavily involved with conducting field assessments and monitoring third-party field work for environmental and reclamation field projects. The candidate must be able to work with a diverse group of people in a dynamic working environment.

The position will be based in our Fort St. John, BC office with frequent travel throughout our Northeast BC operations, and travel to our Calgary office as required.

#### **Key Responsibilities and Accountabilities**

- Manage environmental and regulatory issues with internal and external stakeholders to ensure understanding and compliance
- Support Field Operations, with a focus on environment and regulatory requirements
- Represent PETRONAS Canada in specific discussions with regulators and stakeholders
- Execution of environmental projects to maintain cost, schedule, regulatory reporting and requirements
- Manage the cleanup of spills, and importantly the avoidance of them
