## **Ministry of Forests**

### **100 Mile House, Quesnel, or Williams Lake (Hybrid)**

This position can be based in any of the following Ministry of Forests Cariboo Region District Offices: 100 Mile House, Quesnel, or Williams Lake. Flexible work options are available; this position may be able to work up to two (2) days at home per week subject to an approved Telework Agreement. Applicants who do not fully meet the required qualifications may be considered for this position, but at a lower classification.

### **Wildlife Engagement Specialist**

The Ministry of Forests is responsible for the stewardship of provincial Crown land and ensures the sustainable management of forest, wildlife, water and other land-based resources. The ministry manages these resources in a manner that embraces the economic, environmental and social goals of government.

This Wildlife Engagement Specialist position will implement and support wildlife management with a focus on leading First Nation engagement as it relates to wildlife management. A strong wildlife management and human dimensions background will contribute to leading collaborative wildlife management activities focused on Indigenous reconciliation and improving wildlife management in the Cariboo Region.

### **Qualifications for this role include:**

- Registered (or immediately eligible for registration) as a Registered Professional Biologist (RPBio) in BC with the College of Applied Biology (CAB). Note: Immediately eligible for registration is defined as being able to transfer a current membership from an applicable jurisdiction to the CAB within six (6) months of employment. Confirmation of registration/eligibility is required before an offer of employment can be made.
- Minimum of a bachelor's degree in biological sciences or related field plus 3 or more years of related experience.
- Experience assessing and monitoring natural resources including engaging First Nations in wildlife management projects or programs including collaboratively delivered work.
